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1. Introduction: Study Approach, Method & Overview of Genesis

o Importance of the Old Testament

"The Old Testament (OT) is a gift to us. Many people today regard the New Testament (NT) as contradicting and surpassing the OT, yet the early church viewed the OT and NT as a unity."

Dr Stephen Chapman, Old Testament Professor, Duke Divinity School

Dr Chapman also points out that

- The OT was the Christian Bible prior to the composition and collection of the NT
- Jesus was a Jew

The OT and NT are "interpretive of each other" - Christopher Seitz

Paul wrote that:

- "For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope." Romans 15:4 NRSV
- 15 how from childhood you [Timothy] have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.
 16 All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:15, 16

John Wesley noted:

"what is the rule whereby men [humans] are to judge of right and wrong?"
"the Christian rule of right and wrong is the word of God, the writings of the
Old and New Testament; all that the Prophets and holy men of old wrote as
they were moved by the holy Ghost; all that Scripture which was given by
inspiration of God, and which is indeed profitable for doctrine, or teaching the
whole will of God; for reproof of what is contrary thereto; for correction or
error; and for instruction, or training us up, in righteousness."

"It should be observed, that this [2 Timothy 3:16] is spoken primarily and directly of the Scriptures which Timothy had known from a child; which must have been those of the old Testament, for the New was not then wrote [written]"²

Study Approach

Given the above context on the OT, we shall in this study follow what Dr. Chapman calls "bi-directional" reading of the OT. In other words, while focusing on Genesis, we shall not ignore the NT. We shall correlate the Genesis narrative with the gospel of Christ as revealed to us in the NT.

Method

This Bible School will follow a three-part sequence:

- Weekly Short Lecture
 This will be on Wednesday evenings and will give an overview of the theme for the chapters we are studying in the week following that meeting.
- Personal Study
 There will be an outline with a breakdown for day by day personal study at home of the chapters being covered that week
- Fellowship Time & Group Discussion
 We shall have small group discussions on the following Wednesday to share what we have each learned over the previous week.

Individual Study Guide

In your daily study, you might find it helpful to

- o Invest about 30 minutes into this each day, or longer if you're able to
- Start with prayer, asking for the Lord to illuminate the scripture more clearly to you at this time.
- Read the text slowly a number of times, if possible, from two or three versions
- o **Reflection**: ask yourself the following questions, where possible
 - who is speaking
 - who is being spoken to or what is the content about
 - what does the text say about God, i.e., God's nature, God's views, etc.
 - what does it say to me about my life and circumstances or the world we live in, etc.
 - personal application: what is the Lord teaching me today from this text, and what am I going to do about it?
 - Any other questions that come to mind as you reflect on the scripture.

Journal: You may find it helpful to keep a study journal in which you write down what you receive through this process of prayer, reflection, meditation

 Close with prayer, a time of prayer inspired by what you have gleaned from the study.

Could be a prayer of thanksgiving, praise to God, repentance from something the Lord shows you is wrong, prayer for guidance, prayer of submission to God's will, or however else you are inspired to pray.

Recommended Study Bible

Our focus in this study is to be taught and nurtured by the scriptures through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Thus, the intent is not to dive into theological and/or scholarly debates or research although that might be referenced from time to time. We will not be delving into the arguments over the text, historicity, etc.

If you are interested in further scholarly input into your study, **The New Interpreter's Study Bible NRSV** by Abingdon Press is a good Bible to consider.

2. Genesis 1 to 4 Overview

• Genesis 1:1 to Genesis 2:4 First Creation Narrative

The focus of this first creation narrative is the creation of universe by God.

1:1-3 indicates that

- o God created the heavens the earth
- The earth was at first a formless void
- o The Spirit of God hovered over the deep
- o God spoke (WORDs), and things came into being
 - light, night and day, the sky, dry land etc.

It seems clear that the creative agent included the Spirit of God that hovered. Cross-reference this passage with:

John 1:1-5 (NRSV text below)
 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4in him was life, and the life was the light of

all people. 5The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not

Proverbs 8:22-31 The Role of Wisdom in creation 22"The Lord brought me forth as the first of his works, before his deeds of old; 23 I was formed long ages ago, at the very beginning, when the world came to be. 24When there were no watery depths, I was given birth, when there were no springs overflowing with water;

27I was there when he set the heavens in place, when he marked out the horizon on the face of the deep, 28when he established the clouds above and fixed securely the fountains of the deep, 29when he gave the sea its boundary so the waters would not overstep his command, and when he marked out the foundations of the earth. 30Then I was constantly at his side

 - 9Then the Lord said to Cain, "Where is your brother Abel?" He said, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"

3. Daily Study Schedule & Questions

Day 1: Genesis 1:1 to 2:4 First Creation Narrative

As you read and study the verses, here are some suggestions of themes to reflect on - see the cross-references in other scripture:

- The role of the Spirit of God in creation
- o The Word
- o The importance of wisdom
- The significance of God's image in each of us as we are created in God's image
- o The significance of Sabbath. Do you practice the sabbath? Should you?

Day 2: Genesis 2:4b-17 The Garden of Eden and Adam's Creation Suggested reflection themes:

- o How God caused a garden to grow importance of seeds and harvest
- o Importance of God's commandments e.g., that given to Adam & Eve

• Day 3: Genesis 2:18-24 - The First Couple - Adam & Eve

Suggested reflection themes:

- o Importance and role of individuals in marital relationship
- The nature and importance of marriage
- O Homework: Search the scriptures: what does the New Testament say about marriage and divorce? Clue: What did Jesus have to say say about it?

• Day 4: Genesis 3:1-24 - Temptation, Original Sin, & Punishment

Suggested reflection themes:

- Temptation and how it works
- The impact of yielding to temptations
- Consequences of Sin
- God's justice and judgement
- Homework: What did God do about redeeming humans after the fall?
 Clue: what has the coming of Jesus, his suffering, death, and resurrection got to do with our redemption?

Day 5: Genesis 4:1-16 - Cain & Abel

Suggested reflection themes:

- Our responsibility for others
- God's expectations of us in human relationships
- How God perceives injustices, and God's judgement on sin

• Day 6: Genesis 4:17-26 - Increasing Population & Civilization

Suggested reflection themes:

- How the population developed and grew
- How civilization developed from our first parents
