Sermon Outline: Jesus the Christ is Revealed, Let Us Live For and With Him!

Readings: Ephesians 1:3-14; John 1:1-5; 10-14

1. 2023, A New Beginning - Where and How do we start?

Scriptural Beginning - with the Spirit of God and the Word

We see a pattern in Scripture:

God begins new things through the work of God's Spirit and God's Word. Words inspired by God's Spirit are uttered and, when believed and acted on, we see God's power at work. Word and Spirit operate closely together.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and **the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. And God said**, 'Let there be light,' and there was light."

Genesis 1:1-3 NIV

Revealed: Jesus, The Word made flesh

John 1 - NIV

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning.

3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made.

4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind.

5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

Importance of the Word

Jesus said: "It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless.

The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life." John 6:63 NRSV

Jesus also said, quoting Moses from Deuteronomy 8:3:

"It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God.' " Matthew 4:4 NKJV

Moses instructed Israel in Deuteronomy 11 (NRSV)"

18 "You shall put these words of mine in your heart and soul, and you shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and fix them as an emblem on your forehead. 19Teach them to your children, talking about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. 20Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates, 21so that your days and the days of your children may be multiplied in the land that the Lord swore to your ancestors to give them, as long as the heavens are above the earth."

God's word is so important it must form the basis of our conversation, waking thoughts, last words before bed, conversation at the dinner table, etc.

2. Revealed: Jesus, the Christ

Christ is not Jesus' last name. It is the Greek for the Hebrew word Messiah, which means the Anointed One. Anointing was the act of pouring oil over someone and, through prayer, invoking the Spirit of God on that person.

In Genesis 3 we see that the first humans sinned against God. Through the rest of the Old Testament, we see God inspiring many prophets to prophesy that God will send a savior, an Anointed One, to deliver us from the power of sin, and restore us to the relationship with God for which we were created.

Jesus is the prophesied Christ (Anointed One, Messiah). He described his purpose in the words of the prophesy in Isaiah 61:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor."

Luke 4:18-19 NRSV

This was the message of the early church: the Anointed One has come. We have experienced his work and we are his witnesses.

36You know the message he [God] sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. 37That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced:

38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. 39We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem."

This must be our message too. In Him was life. We have his life in us. He was the light of the world. He said we are the light of the world now. The same Spirit that empowered Jesus is in us and wants to bless the world through us.

3. Revealed: Who We Are and What We have In Christ

Paul taught a lot in his letters what he received from God through divine revelation

"For I want you to know, brothers and sisters, that the gospel that was proclaimed by me is not of human origin; for I did not receive it from a human source, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ."

Galatians 1:11-12 NRSV

Acts 10:36-39 NRSV

- o In his sharing what was revealed to him, he emphasized a lot who we are and what we have in Christ.
- He also prayed regularly for Christians to get a revelation their status in Christ, and what God has made available to us in Christ.
- Today we focus on some of Paul's "In Christ" teachings in Ephesians 1

In Christ,

- we are blessed with every spiritual blessing in heavenly places
- o we are chosen to be holy and blameless in God's sight
- o we are adopted into God's family as His children
- o God's grace has been freely lavished on us.

- we have redemption through His blood. Our sins are paid for. Our sins are forgiven
- o God's will and purpose is revealed to us
- we were included in God's family when we heard and believed the gospel of salvation
- o we are chosen for the praise of his glorious grace
- The Holy Spirit has come into our lives as the seal and pledge of our salvation and inheritance

4. Revealed: A New Covenant with God through Jesus

As we start a new year, let us renew our Covenant with God by

- remembering who we are in Christ, and professing that
- Praying together in the manner Paul did, asking for God to fill our lives with the reality of Christ and God's power in us.
- reminding ourselves of what God requires of us

"6 With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God?

8 He has shown you, O mortal, what is good.

And what does the Lord require of you?

To act justly and

to love mercy and

to walk humbly with your God"

Micah 6:6,8 NIV

• Committing to offer ourselves as living sacrifices to the Lord and a life of renewing our minds in God's word:

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God-what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Romans 12:1-2 NRSV

How do we renew our minds? With the Word!
